PRINTING INSTRUCTIONS FOR POTLUCK CARDS

Thank you for purchasing my potluck cards. I think it's so important to label your food at parties for people with special dietary concerns and this is an elegant and fun way to let your guests know what everything is!

One of the ways I love to print these out is from .JPG files on blank 4x6 notecards. Many printers have the capacity to print borderless pictures, you may need to experiment with your printer and photo-printing software. (On my Windows computer, when I right-click the .JPG, I can select "Print" and find the option there, but you may have a different setup or your printer may not let you do this.) I like to do it this way because I can print a whole stack without having to trim anything! Then I either lean them against the dishes on the buffet, or bind them together using tape with another blank card to make a little tent to set up.

The one drawback I've noticed here is that my printer interprets the colors of these "photos" to be much darker than the colors in matching PDF files. Because I love for things to coordinate, I wanted to give you the option to print the potluck cards from a PDF so things will match beautifully. (Also helpful if your printer doesn't have the fancy "print-toedge" option for 4x6 paper.) That's why there's a PDF included in your purchase, so you can print on letter paper and trim the cards down.

Either way, you're going to have some great tools to let your guests know what delicious foods are on the buffet line! Happy celebrating!
